In this time of turkeys, eggnog and gift wrap, you should by now have received a letter informing you of the progress made in appointing a steering committee for the regional convention that the Boston chapter will be hosting in 2009.

If the post office makes haste, this newsletter might even find you in time to remind you that said letter invited all members to attend a brainstorming session on Monday November 27, 7:30 PM, at King's Chapel Parish House, 64 Beacon Street.

As for the giving part: The regional convention has the potential to make some money for the Chapter and sustain our activities in the years beyond 2009. After the books are closed on the convention, any proceeds get turned over to the Chapter. While the AGO, as you know, is a not-for-profit educational organization, it is always good to have some cash reserves to fund new and exciting projects just like this one.

Columbus Day in Cambridge

Our second AGO program of the year took place on a sunny October 9th in Cambridge at two churches within an easy walk of each other. Workshop leaders Heinrich Christensen, Peter Krasinski, and Michael Kleinschmidt gave about twenty-five enthusiastic AGO members some pointers on various subjects germane to our profession. Two visiting organists from California also joined us for the day!

Our Dean led off at First Church with a session on the various facets of Weddings. Heinrich's wry humor shone through when he referred to dealing with "Bridezilla" or the happily infrequent experience of visiting karaoke soloists who arrive equipped with programmed boombox. King's Chapel supplies a page of wedding info which guides requests. Heinrich meets the couple at the organ for a consultation (good PR for the organ) and likes to tailor the music to the couple when the conditions are right. As an aside, we learned that a real live prospective pair had heard about the workshop and decided to attend. Heinrich mentioned two websites: www.knot.com for people planning a wedding, and www.trumph.se to download Swedish wedding music.

Peter's workshop on Improvisation began with an overview of the subject, both historical and pragmatic. With assisting volunteers, Peter showed us a few possible techniques to use with hymns. To transform a pentatonic folk hymn into a prelude, Peter suggested an accompaniment of two chords, 1-3-5-6 and 1-4-5-6 in the key, and pedal notes I or V. Simple and effective! In a second hymn, "Question" and "Answer" phrases were extracted and developed as an interlude between verses. Another hymn lent itself to an ostinato pattern which accompanied the tune and filled in as interludes between phrases. Peter was ever encouraging and energetic.

After a walk to Mem Church in Harvard Yard and a box lunch, we retired to Appleton Chapel where Michael gave us a mini-course on Hymn-playing. He stressed a thoughtful approach to this practice which we all do, recommending that we get to know a hymn thoroughly before playing it in the service – all lines, text, tempo and clear, predictable cues! Michael demonstrated the comfort of a consistent breathing space (say, two beats) between verses. Free hymn accompaniments might be exciting, but might also overwhelm and discourage the congregation - not exactly what we are after.

The last session of the day consisted of a hymn-sing, with requests from the expert AGO "chorus" assembled. (We were anybody's dream congregation.) Michael and Peter took turns accompanying on the Fisk, showing at the same time how very differently two accomplished musicians play hymns. It was just as fascinating to see (and hear) how each went about exploring the organ while "on the spot." A fun day with good people, good listening and singing.

Recital Celebrates Leo Abbott's 20th Anniversary in Grand Style

Having celebrated the 130th anniversary of the Hook & Hastings grand organ in Holy Cross Cathedral with a gala concert last February, Leo Abbott lined up some of Boston's finest (organists, that is) on October 29 to join him in celebrating his 20th year as organist of Holy Cross. The result was an impressive and interesting potpourri of selections that showed off the versatility of the historic organ, including a new work by Parisian composer Naji Hakim commissioned for the occasion.

Lois Regestein commenced the program with two works representing the two "golden ages" of French repertoire, François Couperin's varied Offertoire (Mass for the Convents), and the Allegro from Widor's 6th Symphony. The coolly sedate Couperin set the stage for the Widor, which bounced briskly off the walls in true Parisian fashion. Next came the one transcription on the program, played by James Busby, and a most interesting one it was. Bach's well-loved Chaconne from the Suite in D Minor was written for unaccompanied violin, and while it has been transcribed fairly verbatim for piano (by Brahms, among others) and chamber ensemble, transcriber John Cook's approach seems to have been "let's see what Bach would have done if he was writing it for the organ instead of the violin." The result was a reworking that, while faithful to the notes, took them through a varied forest of strings and flutes to a sweeping full organ conclusion, and Busby was in full control of the seemingly complex score to the finish. The first half of the program was concluded by Rodger Vine, who provided an element of contrast with two quieter pieces. A suave Allegretto by Italian Baroque composer Pescetti nicely showcased the organ's milder flute stops, and Duruflé's gently lyrical posthumous Méditation did the same for the strings. Vine closed with another French blockbuster, a rousing Finale on Ave Maris Stella by his former teacher, Jeanne Joulain. Joulain, a pupil of Dupré, is a composer who should be heard more often; this work gave her mentor's setting of the same plainsong theme a good run for the money.

The second half of the program opened with Leo Abbott's performance of the much anticipated commissioned work, Hakim's *Esquisses Grégoriennes en forme de Messe basse*, and it did not disappoint. Because organists have complained about the somewhat off-putting nature of Hakim's usual extended works, Abbott had specifically requested a set of shorter pieces, which he hoped would encourage more organists to play them, and be of interest to the more advanced students – as I believe will indeed be the case.

This is not to say that very many of us could expect to sit down and sight-read them. They are in fact of varying difficulty, each presenting its own challenges, and while these five "sketches" are arranged to form a low mass, each can stand alone quite nicely. Perhaps most accessible are No. 1 (Nos autem; *Entrée*) and No. 4 (Ave verum; *Communion*); No. 2 (Ave maris stella; *Offertoire*) is perhaps the most extended, utilizing a variety of colors, and No. 3 (Pater noster; *Elévation*) a close second, while No. 5 (O filii et filiae; *Sortie*) is a noholds-barred virtuoso showpiece. Needless to say, Abbott's performance was polished and exciting, exploiting the resources of the Holy Cross organ as only he can.

Laurence Carson then brought us across the Channel to Edwardian England, with two well-chosen selections from Frank Bridge's Three Pieces, a suave Adagio in E Major, and Allegro con spirito, played indeed with considerable spirit. Janet Hunt followed with Petr Eben's excitingly varied Wedding in Cana (from Four Biblical Dances), and brought the whole program to a satisfying close with a polished performance of Tournemire's well-known improvisation on Victimae Paschali. All six performers should be commended for creative programming in their choice of repertoire that produced an enjoyable mix of periods, countries and styles. Following the recital, all were invited downstairs to the choir room to partake of goodies provided by Leo's faithful choirfolks, and to wish Leo many more years of quality music-making at Holy Cross Cathedral.
