The Rev. Dr. Horace T. Allen is the retired Professor of Worship and Preaching at Boston University School of Theology where he taught for twenty-five years. He has also served as Visiting Professor of Liturgical Studies at Yale University. Dr. Allen is an ordained minister of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), a member of its Eastern Korean Presbytery. He has served as Interim Minister of the First Presbyterian Church of Brookline, MA. He has represented his church on the Worship Commission of the Consultation on Church Union (COCU), and is also a member of the North America Consultation on Common Texts and founding Co-Chair of the international and ecumenical English Language Liturgical Consultation.

Dr. Allen holds academic degrees from Princeton University, Harvard Divinity School, and Union Theological Seminary. He has also studied at Princeton Theological Seminary. He has lectured at numerous universities and seminaries around the world, including Union Seminary; Westminster Choir College; Notre Dame University; Andover Newton Theological School in Newton, MA; Harvard Divinity School as Lecturer in Ministry; the Weston School of Theology (Jesuit), Cambridge, MA, as Visiting Lecturer in Preaching; the Presbyterian College and Theological Seminary in Seoul, Korea; and the Department of Religious Studies at Peking University in Beijing, China, having been the first Christian theologian to have taught in that department. Dr. Allen has also written countless articles and introductions for theological journals and liturgical publications, has been active as a minister both here and abroad, and has maintained his musical interests as singer, double bass player and conductor.

Organ Library News Recycling Empty Boxes

Despite the rise in e-commerce, someone has to "move the atoms," as the saying goes. Consequently, we all receive a steady supply of boxes filled with those little white things that adhere to everything in sight except each other. Next time such a box comes to hand, consider filling it up with organ music that no longer fits your needs and donate it to The Organ Library (Boston University School of Theology, 745 Commonwealth Ave., Room 2B, Boston, MA 02215). Donations of music and books relating to the organ and organ music are tax deductible.

At present, the Organ Library's holdings amount to more than 5,000 items—a large amount of music indeed, but a major research facility devoted to organ literature needs constantly to enrich its resources. Last November, I spoke with a collector in England whose private holdings consist of approximately 20,000 items. We have a long way to go. Strengthening the Library, which belongs to the Boston Chapter, is a responsibility for all members of the Chapter. Cathedral Replica Console To Be Inaugurated

On Sunday, February 22 at 2 p.m., the new console of the E. & G. G. Hook & Hastings Organ at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross will be inaugurated by several artists including Peter Sykes, Rosalind Mohnsen, Peter Krasinski, Nina Bergeron, Dong ill Shin and Cathedral Music Director and Organist, Leo Abbott. Mr. Abbott will perform the World Première of Naji Hakim's "Gregoriana," a work composed in memory of Theodore and Alice Marier. The piece is based on three chant themes and was funded in part through a grant from the Special Projects Committee of the Boston Chapter AGO.

The new console was designed after blueprints and photographs of the original console which was discarded in the 1920's, and was replaced with a second-hand theater organ console. The project was made possible with a matching grant from the Massachusetts Preservation Projects Fund through the Massachusetts Historical Commission. The contract was awarded to the Andover Organ Company. In addition to the console, a completely new multi-system by Solid State Organ Systems was installed. All wiring in the organ was replaced and brought up to current electrical codes. The pull-down action was also restored, and missing pipes of the Great Doppel Flöte were replaced by pipes from another Hook organ.

The project was overseen by Preservation Planner Carol DiNinno, Music Director Leo Abbott, and Consultant Barbara Owen.

Requiescat in Pace

Thomas L. Finch

Thomas Lassfolk Finch, 77, died of pancreatic cancer Dec. 18, 2003. Born in Madison, Wisconsin, he graduated from Wisconsin High school in 1945. Attending the University of Wisconsin, he received a bachelor's degree in 1947, a master's degree in 1949, and a PhD in physics in 1954. He taught physics at Union College, Schenectady, N.Y. from 1955-1957, and then joined the faculty at St. Lawrence University, Canton, N.Y., where he taught until his retirement in 1989.

He was interested in musical acoustics and did research on pipe organ acoustics with Arthur Benade at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio, and with Wilson Nolle at the University of Texas in Austin, Texas, publishing some of the results in the Journal of the Acoustical Society of America.

Dr. Finch became interested in the pipe organ in the 1940's, studying organ performance concurrently with his study of physics. He became a member of the American Guild of Organists in 1950, remaining a member of the St. Lawrence Valley Chapter until his death. From 1990 he was a dual member of the Boston chapter, doing volunteer service at the Boston AGO Library.

Dr. Finch served as organist of the Unitarian-Universalist Church in Canton, N. Y., from 1963 to 1989. He pursued a life-long interest in historic pipe organs, serving nine years as vice-president of the Organ Historical Society. He was presented with the Society's Distinguished Service Award in 1990, and attended 45 of the Society's annual conventions, which are held in different parts of the country to feature area distinguished organs. In 1970 he organized one of the conventions in the North Country, with Canton as the base. He also served as a committee member for the 1980 convention in Ithaca, N.Y. and for the 2000 convention in Boston. In recent years he and his wife added OHS European tours to visit organs, including France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, the Netherlands, and most recently Sweden.
