Michel Bouvard in Recital

Church of the Advent

Sunday, February 12, 4 PM

As we have all been told repeatedly in the media, Homeland Security has been tightened these last few years. Among other things, we are now well protected from being invaded by renegade organists. As these lines are written, we have had to give up our original plan of featuring Dutch organist Ben van Oosten as our guest recitalist for the spring semester, as his visa application was not accepted. Thankfully, the wonderful French organist Michel Bouvard has agreed to step in and has only one more interview to complete at the embassy in Paris to get his visa approval so he can come play for us. Please keep your fingers crossed.

Maitre Bouvard is planning an exciting program for us, including selections from Vierne's 3rd Symphony and Pièces de Fantaisie, as well as music by his own grandfather, Jean Bouvard, who was a student of both Vierne and Widor.

We are most grateful to the Church of the Advent and music director Edith Ho for welcoming BAGO back to their beautiful space. As many of you know, the organ underwent extensive renovation work last year, so don't miss this opportunity to enjoy the instrument in its new splendor!

Michel Bouvard was born in Lyon in 1958. After studying piano, he was accepted in the organ class of André Isoir. While serving as deputy organist of Saint-Séverin Church, he perfected his studies with Michel Chapuis, Francis Chapelet and Jean Boyer, after which he became organist titulaire of this beautiful Parisian instrument for more than ten years.

In 1983, Bouvard won the premier prix of the International Organ Competition in Toulouse.

Two years later he succeeded Xavier Darasse as professor of organ at the Conservatoire National de Région de Toulouse.

Michel Bouvard's reputation as concert organist and teacher has taken him to over 20 countries, and he is frequently sought after as adjudicator for the most prestigious organ

competitions. In 1995, he was named professor of organ at the Conservatoire National Supérieur in Paris where he teaches with Oliver Latty. M. Bouvard is organiste titulaire of the historic Cavaillé-Coll organ of the Basilique Saint-Sernin in Toulouse.

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes November 14, 2005

The meeting was called to order, at 7 pm, by Margaret Angelini, dean. Also present were Heinrich Christensen, Cheryl Duerr, Tim Hughes, Brian Jones, Carl Klein, Josh Lawton, David Owens, Joan Reddy, Joyce Painter Rice, Lee Ridgway, Andrew Shenton, Sally Slade Warner and Mary Sue Willie.

1. Minutes of the last meeting were approved with one correction: the spelling of "Christensen."
2. Treasurer C Klein distributed copies of his report. Under PROGRAMS he noted that both receipts and disbursements are approximately \$5,000 more than the amounts budgeted. Klein recommended an increase of \$4500 in PROGRAMS disbursements (for programs through First Night). The motion was made and voted.
3. Membership Sec., T Hughes (see below, 6B)
4. Registrar, JP Rice: Chapter Programs summaries have been submitted to *TAO*.
5. Dean.
 - A. Continuing the process of establishing the office of *Assistant Treasurer*. On January 10 at the Organ Library event, a brief business meeting will be held to vote approval of this new office. If passed, candidate(s) for the office will be nominated and elected in the spring. The Assistant Treasurer would assume duties on June 1.
 - B. Report re grievance proceedings. Specified procedures are being followed pursuant to a request that the chapter begin grievance proceeding against a church. If the investigation is undertaken, notice will be made in the newsletter and on the website.
6. Committee reports.
 - A. Library, re honorarium for Angelo Castaldo, Italian organist who will present the Organ Library lecture/recital on Jan. 10. Castaldo does not have the O-1 visa that is required for foreigners to be paid for work in the USA. Klein reported his research about this type of visa. This matter affects our chapter in regard to the February 2006 program also. (*Addendum*: In December the Organ Library Committee decided to pay Castaldo's expenses.)
 - B. Membership, T Hughes reporting. Seventy non-renewing members were contacted. Thirty-five said they plan to renew, and 6 renewals have been received.
 - C. Newsletter. J Swist, editor, will begin a new procedure of sending a confirmation e-mail to those who submit articles or concert listings. The newsletter is posted on the website, (on the sub-site available to members only) before it is mailed. Discussion followed about posting the concert calendar on the "public" website. What about articles? Mark Nelson is the site manager.
 - D. Nominating Committee. Margaret has asked Bob Johnson to chair the committee and expects a reply soon. The committee is to have 3 members, one of whom may be a current member of the Exec. Com. (MS Willie and L Ridgway were mentioned as possible members.)
- E. Professional Development. Committee has been contacted about a grievance proceeding (see 5B). The Substitute List will be posted on the website.
- F. Programs/Centennial Celebration. H Christensen, reporting.
 - i. Westminster Abbey Choir concert had audience of 980. Income \$18,815. We did not make a profit despite Trinity Church appearing to be full. Discussion that the magnitude of this concert pushed our volunteer capabilities to the limit and may mean that such projects are too difficult. Considerations: our educational mission; possibility of linking up with other arts organizations; plan further in advance, especially details such as ticket sales.
 - ii. The Franck organ festival, with Jon Gillock, concludes this week.
 - iii. First Night recitalists are Patrick Kabanda, Douglas Major and Louise Munding.
 - iv. Ben van Oosten, recitalist for February 12, does not have an O-1B visa, and his concert tour may be cancelled. If so, Heinrich will seek a substitute.
- G. Young Organists Initiative, MS Willie reporting. Auditions were postponed from November 5 to January 21. We need to appeal to the public, announcing this opportunity for students ages 12-18. The students receive 10 lessons (free) and an 18-month AGO membership. They are expected to play in recitals at the conclusion of their study.
7. New Business
 - A. Re: mailing labels purchased from the chapter: can they be used more than once? Margaret said that address changes are so frequent that a new set of labels should be ordered for each mailing.
 - B. Announcement re Christ Church, Cambridge: Thomas Murray will play the dedicatory recital for the Schoenstein organ on April 30.
 - C. Announcements re Boston Univ: A Shenton distributed a flyer about the BU Master of Sacred Music program, for which he is program director. In December 2008 (or possibly in June), BU may sponsor a symposium on the music of Messiaen. (Messiaen's dates are Dec 10, 1908 - Apr 27, 1992).
 - D. Question re "From the top" public radio program: have organists been performers on this program? YOI has looked into possibility.
8. The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 pm.
