Boston's First Night 2008: A Player's Perspective

As Boston AGO members have been doing since the earliest days of Boston's First Night, another three of us held forth, for 20 minutes each, this past December 31st, beginning at 10 p.m., at Arlington Street Church. The performers were Harry Huff, Janet Hunt, and myself. Chapter member Rodger Vine, artist in residence at Arlington Street, has coordinated this annual presentation for 25 years, and it is probably our largest live representation of the Boston AGO to the public. This year's audience numbered 361.

From the very beginning, the general theme for the BAGO concert has been "light and serious music for the organ". Some years, the performers lean more towards one or the other in their selections, but most of the time it has been a nice mix. This year, the three of us landed more on the "lighter" side of the repertoire, although certainly several of the pieces required some very serious playing: the mighty 1957 Aeolian-Skinner got a full workout! What struck me was the fact that the audience treated this as a serious concert – as does Rodger. If you have ever been to First Night, you know it can get rather rowdy on the streets, and for some performances around the city, people come and go, often tooting their own horns (literally!). Those who came into Arlington Street Church, however, stayed the whole hour (the few who did leave, doing so very quietly), listened attentively, and applauded enthusiastically. While Janet and Harry were playing, I could see that many of the audience in the church's balconies (almost full) were engaged in watching just how an organist operates, and quite a few were taking photos. All in all, I think everyone – including we who performed – enjoyed the whole affair.

So, if Rodger comes calling, say "yes" and do your part in promoting the organ, its music, and the Boston AGO. You will still have plenty of time left for New Year's Eve champagne afterward!

Christoph Wolff at the Organ Library

The eminent Bach scholar Christoph Wolff, professor of music at Harvard University, will offer a presentation, "J. S. Bach and the Organ: New Perspectives on an Old Subject," on Monday evening, February 25th at 7:00 PM at the School of Theology, Boston University (745 Commonwealth Avenue). His multi-media presentation will be followed by a reception at the Organ Library on the basement level of the STH building. Participants will also be able to preview the Library's new website and browse though the approximately 1,000 titles of used organ music currently on sale. A small exhibition of Bachiana from the Library's holdings will be on display.

Professor Wolff, Adams University Professor at Harvard, graduated from the Hochschule für Musik Berlin in 1963 (organ, historical keyboards, conducting) and received his Ph.D. in historical musicology from the University of Erlangen in 1966. He has been the recipient of honorary degrees from the New England Conservatory, Valparaiso University, and the University of Jena-Weimar. A member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the American Philosophical Society, the Saxon Academy of Sciences at Leipzig, and the Akademie für Mozart-Forschung in Salzburg, he also serves as Director of the Bach-Archiv Leipzig.

Professor Wolff's most recent publications have included Bach: Essays on His Life and Music (1991), Mozart's Requiem (1994), The New Bach Reader (1998), Die Orgeln J. S. Bachs: Ein Handbuch (2006), and a book (2007) on the reception of Bach's music in the age of Mendelssohn and Schumann. The American Musicological Society bestowed on him the Otto Kinkeldey Award for Johann Sebastian Bach: The Learned Musician (2000), a monograph that has already been translated into eight languages. He has edited a catalogue of the long-lost Bach sources of the Berlin Sing-Akademie and numerous works of Bach that have been published in the Neue Bach-Ausgabe.

All members of the Chapter are invited to this singular opportunity to learn more about Bach, his music for the organ, and the organs for which his music was conceived.

Workshop: "Body Mapping for Organists" Led by Dr. Roberta Gary

On Monday, February 18th from 9:00 am – 3:00 pm, Dr. Roberta Gary will present a workshop for organists on the C. B. Fisk organ at Old West Church, 131 Cambridge Street, Boston. Co-sponsored by the Old West Organ Society and Region I of the Association of Anglican Musicians, the presentation is intended to help organists learn to play the instrument with proper use of the body. There will be a demonstration of *Movements Organists Make*, using examples from Bach to Liszt. A few quotes include: "the keyboard is flat, but we are not", "move in the direction the music moves", "there is no such thing as your waist", and "don't keep your knees together!" Assisting in the presentation will be Dr. Gary's husband, Thomas Miles (organist at Christ Church Cathedral, Cincinnati, and at Isaac M. Wise Temple), and a small skeleton named Fred.

"Body Mapping" is a system that has been championed by Barbara Conable in her application of the principles of Alexander Technique. Our "Body Maps" are our physical self-representations, conceived neurologically. If our Body Maps are accurate, we move well. If our Body Maps are inconsistent with the reality of our structures, we do not. When musicians consciously correct and refine their body maps, the results are efficient, graceful, coordinated, and effective movements. Not only does the ability for musical expression become enhanced, but also the risks of performance-related injuries are considerably reduced.

Dr. Gary, Professor of Organ at the College Conservatory of Music of the University of Cincinnati, has been certified by Barbara Conable to teach, *What Every Organist Needs to Know About the Body.* For more information regarding Dr. Gary and Body Mapping, please direct your attention to: www.bodymap.org.

The fee for the all-day workshop is \$60 (includes lunch, coffee, and refreshments).


