Boston Ago At "First Night"

The First Night program of the Chapter was among more than 250 performances and events taking place in 30 venues for "First Night 2007". Over one million people attended this year's events in downtown Boston, where unseasonably warm weather made for a very pleasant evening.

Performing on the Aeolian-Skinner organ at Arlington Street Church at 10:00 p.m. were three chapter members, each of whom gave a twenty minute recital for an hour of "Light and Serious Music" for the organ. The program was well attended and all three organists performed wonderfully.

Carl Klein presented works of Saint-Saëns, Dupré, Gigout, Searle Wright, and Widor with clarity and rhythmic drive. Especially enjoyed by the audience was the delightful *Carol Prelude on Greensleeves* by Wright.

Frances Burmeister then favored us with music of Alain, Vierne, and Dudley Buck. Her renditions of *Naïades* of Vierne and *Concert Variations on The Star-Spangled Banner* of Buck showed her virtuosity and fine musicianship.

Concluding the program was Rodger Vine, Artist-in-Residence at Arlington Street Church, and organizer of the AGO First Night organ recitals since 1983. He performed an entertaining arrangement of Christmas carols by Leavitt, *Auld Lang Syne* as arranged by Lemare and the *Prelude and Fugue on the name of Alain* of Duruflé. His performance was masterful, bringing to a brilliant close the "AGO First Night Recitals 2007".

First Night began in 1976 in Boston, and since that time numerous other cities have taken up the idea. Arlington Street Church held organ recitals on First Night starting in 1979, when Joyce Painter Rice presented the first one, and later included the Choir in the performances. An Organ Marathon was held on First Night 1981 at Old West Church, observing the 75th anniversary of the Boston Chapter and featuring eight performers. It was co-sponsored by the Guild and First Night, Inc. In addition, other programs that year celebrating the 75th were held at Trinity Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, and Arlington Street Church. Since that time, the AGO program has been changed to one location and has been held in various places, including


St. Paul's Cathedral, Trinity Church, Church of the Covenant and others. It is an opportunity for the AGO to reach a new audience.

Pipe Organ Encounter

The Springfield Chapter is sponsoring a "full-feature" Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) at Smith College, Northampton, Massachusetts. Dates are Sunday, July 22 - Friday, July 27, 2007. A huge array of events is planned, including private lessons with distinguished faculty, seminars, faculty recitals, student recitals, field trips to organs and organ factories, parties, and FUN!

The POE is open to young people ages 13-18 who have intermediate proficiency at the piano and/or organ. Enrollment will be limited to 36 students. There will be two tracks of instruction: one for beginning organists and one for students who have studied organ previously. The local POE committee may choose to grant special consideration on an individual basis for admission of a potential registrant whose age or training differs from the guidelines.

This will be the only POE in the immediate area this year, and it is already almost half-subscribed.
