BAGO Presents Joan Lippincott

- 1) Masterclass on hymn playing, Saturday, November 12, 10 a.m. to 12 noon, St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, 16 Great Road, Sudbury. Co-sponsored with the Worcester Chapter. J. W. Walker organ. Free admission.
- 2) Organ recital, Sunday, November 13, 4 p.m., Parish of All Saints, Ashmont, 209 Ashmont Street, Dorchester. (Around the corner from Red Line's Ashmont Station; church is handicapped-accessible.) \$20 general admission; \$15 students, seniors, AGO members. Tickets to be purchased at the church.

Joan Lippincott's masterclass on hymn playing will address how best to lead congregations in vigorous hymn singing by looking at the style of hymns and how that might influence the way we play them (registration, tempo, harmonization, etc.) Participants are encouraged to come prepared to play a hymn.

Joan Lippincott's program on the Fisk organ of All Saints includes J. S. Bach's *Passacaglia in C Minor*, Mozart's *Fantasia in F Minor*, K.608, and music by American composer Ned Rorem. In addition she commemorates the birth anniversaries of two composers: the 200th anniversary of Franz Liszt with his ever-popular showpiece, *Prelude and Fugue on BACH*, and the 100th anniversary of French composer Jehan Alain, with his expressive and evocative *Trois Danses*.

Lippincott is highly praised as one of America's outstanding organ virtuosos, having performed extensively in the United States, Europe and Canada. She has been a featured recitalist at Alice Tully Hall at Lincoln Center in New York City, at the Spoleto USA Festival, at The American Bach Society Biennial, at the Dublin (Ireland) International Organ Festival, and at conventions of the American Guild of Organists. Her most recent Boston performance was in 2009 at the Boston Early Music Festival. This past summer she played the dedicatory concert on the new Noack organ at the First United Methodist Church, Chatham.

Dr. Lippincott currently devotes her time to concertizing and recording. Her many recordings on the Gothic label include music of Bach, Duruflé, Mozart, Mendelssohn, Widor, Alain, and Pinkham on major American organs. She was Principal University Organist at Princeton University from 1993 to 2000, and is Professor Emerita of Organ at Westminster Choir College of Rider University.

All Saints, Ashmont, houses a large three-manual organ by C. B. Fisk. The organ was completed in 1995 and sits in a custom-built rear gallery. The organ's varied and colorful sounds make it an ideal instrument for the performance of music from all periods. The live and warm acoustic of the room provide an ideal environment for hearing this outstanding instrument.

The church building of All Saints, completed in 1893, was the first church designed by the 26-year-old Ralph Adams Cram, who would go on to become one of America's outstanding architects. Cram's design of All Saints in a neo-Gothic style set the tone for his future work, and strongly influenced subsequent building in American and Europe. Among Cram's masterpieces are the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, New York City, and many churches and other buildings now on the National Register of Historic Places.

Communications Taskforce Update

Have you ever read about a concert in the Chapter newsletter, then promptly forget about it? Have you missed a Chapter event because it wasn't on your calendar? And can you locate the most current list of substitutes? Do you even have time to read e-mails and newsletters thoroughly?

Then you are not alone.... For the past few months, the Communications Taskforce has been meeting to discuss ways to make BAGO information more accessible to our members. We want to bring all of our communications (newsletter, website, e-mail, concert listings, etc.) to you in a timely manner, and tailored to your interests. After several meetings, the Executive Committee has approved going ahead with transitioning Chapter communications to other formats.

The Communications Taskforce is planning to transition to new forms of communication, and we are beginning with this announcement.

The first step of our plan is to rely on the website for the substitute list, beginning in December. The website has the most updated list of substitutes, and will be much easier to read. In the future, this list can be enhanced to contain more information about the skills of the people on the sub list (resumes, certifications, etc).

You have already seen another of the tools we will use. This summer, we used Pipe Organ Encounters as a trial to test the "Constant Contact" software. This software protects member privacy and security, while allowing Chapter members to receive information 'just in time'. The POE updates were interesting, colorful and attention-grabbing. You'll be seeing more of this type of communication soon.

In the next few newsletters, you will learn about how to input concert information into our website and to subscribe to automatic notifications of concerts of interest to you. We will be explaining how to receive and calendar the most current listing of events. Our plan is to have the concert calendar totally online by March 1, 2012.

MSM Program at Notre Dame

At the moment I am recruiting students for our Master of Sacred Music program at the University of Notre Dame. We are extremely excited about what is going on here. The degree combines music (two organ recitals, organ literature, music history) and liturgy courses. There are details of the program on the website: www.nd.edu/~msm/

There are eight organ students in the MSM program—four in each class. The program is extremely competitive (we had sixteen applications last year for four slots), and the level of playing is extremely high. The assistantships pay full tuition for two years plus a stipend of \$12,500 per year for two years. Typically a student on an assistantship works in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart on campus.

All students in our MSM program are supported with tuition grants. If you know of any prospective undergraduate students or others who are not currently enrolled in a graduate program, I would appreciate hearing from you. I will be happy to contact them.


