Evensong and Installation of Officers

Sunday, September 27, 4:30 p.m. The Church of the Advent 30 Brimmer St, Boston (Beacon Hill)

Our opening fall event will be a service of Choral Evensong at the Church of the Advent, with the Advent choir under the direction of Mark Dwyer assisted by Ross Wood. Included will be the installation of Chapter Officers.

As is stated on the Church of the Advent's website www.theadvent.org, "From the very foundation of the parish in 1844, we have sought to worship the Lord in 'the beauty of holiness and the holiness of beauty." This is the experience of worship found by so many (musicians especially) at this church. Whatever your religious persuasion is, however, there are universal components of prayer and music in Evensong.

Gounod's Messe solennelle at St. Cecilia's

A great sacred music event of 2009 took place at St. Cecilia's Church in Boston on the evening of July 23rd. The Chœur d'Enfants d'Ile-de-France and the Jeune Chœur d'Ile-de-France (120 voices), under the direction of Francis Bardot, performed Charles Gounod's monumental Messe solennelle de Ste. Cécile (1855), joined by the Jeune Orchestre Symphonique Maurice Ravel. The article "Roman Catholic church music" (V.3) in The New Grove Dictionary remarks that of the Mass "once enjoyed enormous popularity; it owed its success to a broadly conceived lyricism, formal clarity, effective harmonic shifts and uncomplicated choral writing." (Since the undersigned wrote the article in question, he may be forgiven for quoting it.) The orchestra, the choirs of children (singing from memory!) and young adults arrayed before the altar of St. Cecilia's made an impression fully complemented by the waves of sound that coursed through the large church. An added pleasure was the rare opportunity to hear Camille Saint-Saëns's "Organ" Symphony with Richard Clark, titulaire of an organ that matched the sound of the large orchestra under the direction of its own conductor, Vincent Renaud. All in all, an unforgettable experience.

The competition was held at the Church of St. John the Evangelist on Bowdoin Street; our thanks go to Jeffrey Mills, host organist, for his assistance and support.

At the Regional Convention, I also coordinated the regional competitions. Mr. Street went on to compete again at the Regional Convention against a competitor from Connecticut, where Mr. Street again won the competition. It was held at Old West Church. Our thanks go to Yuko Hayashi for her assistance and support, as well. Mr. Street will now be invited to perform (not compete) at the national convention next summer in Washington, D.C., as part of the "Rising Stars" series. For Region II, the winner was John Walthausen, also a student of Jim Christie, but at Oberlin.

These competitions are an important aspect of our Chapter's mission to advance and improve our profession, and I am honored to have the responsibility of coordinating them.
