Dean's Message

Back before I was elected Sub-Dean, I made occasional entries into a journal when I had the time or when inspiration struck. The entries were of varying lengths and were rather infrequent, but they were there nonetheless. I rediscovered that old journal during a fit of housecleaning, and caught myself rereading a portion that was written at a critical decision point in my life. I was unhappy in my church job – yet again – and was trying to decide if I would even continue in church music. Not being the type to sit still and stew in my own juices, I took up a project that I had long wanted to try in order to distract myself ~ I built a stone wall. What follows here are some of my reflections upon completing the project.

"It is both solving a jigsaw puzzle and backbreaking labor, and when you're done you have a permanent feature on the landscape. The rocks have been in the barn for years, waiting for me to find the time and the courage to assemble them...

Once the building got underway I felt that I got to know some of those stones extremely well; their heft, color, shapes, angles, and quirks took on quiet, stubborn personalities as I went. I frequently caught myself asking the stone "do you really want to go there or not," only to find that if I had to ask then it didn't belong. There were probably only 4 or 5 rocks that were moved less than 3 times, and that was only because they were so heavy that right or wrong I was not going to pick them up again!

It can be surprising the way that some of the solutions literally fall into place. You'll fuss, fidget, kick, punch, grunt, curse, and carry to no avail for more than an hour, and then suddenly 3 feet of wall will drop into place and never move again. You know you've found the spot when the stone settles with a thud, the whole wall shudders almost imperceptibly, and then the stone never moves again. It's as if the whole wall rejoices when that stone comes home. It is so physically and mentally absorbing that you forget to eat, forget to reapply sunscreen, forget why you started the project. It is also very calming, especially when I look over the porch rail and see what I have accomplished."

When looking back over the last four years, one would have to admit that there are many hands that build us up. Like that long-ago construction project, many

I cannot thank you all enough for what you do to make this the wonderful Chapter that it is, and it has been my pleasure to serve as your dean.

Tasting Dinner to Benefit Youth pro Musica

Youth pro Musica, the Greater Boston youth chorus, offers 10 people the opportunity to enjoy a unique pre-concert "tasting" dinner with Youth pro Musica Artistic Director Peter Krasinski and Pulitzer Prize winning music critic/poet Lloyd Schwartz at Elephant Walk, 900 Beacon St, Boston, on Friday, June 2. Following Elephant Walk's special Spring Tasting Dinner, these lucky 10 people move on to Boston University's Marsh Chapel to hear YpM's Peter Krasinski demonstrate the wonders of the pipe organ and improvise to the comedic silent film, "Ella Cinders" (1926) starring Colleen Moore and Lloyd Hughes.

Lloyd Schwartz is classical music critic for National Public Radio's "Fresh Air," and classical music editor of The Boston Phoenix. He is the Frederick S. Troy Professor of English and director of the creative writing program at the University of Massachusetts in Boston. He is the author of three volumes of poems: *These People, Goodnight, Gracie* and *Cairo Traffic*; and received the 1994 Pulitzer Prize for criticism.

Organ Library News

In Praise of Volunteers

A few years ago, the National Endowment for the Humanities reported on the dependence of thousands of local museums and libraries on volunteers to maintain their services. Volunteers met about 50% of the staffing and management needs of cultural institutions that exist in bewildering variety across the land. From the standpoint of these statistics, the Organ Library of the Boston Chapter is even more dependent on the services and enthusiasm of volunteers. Anita Nagem and Wendy Covell, in collaboration with the chairman, have recatalogued virtually the entire Library and have assumed the task of entering all new acquisitions into the electronic database, now the catalogue of record. (Barbara Swist and Esther Kwok also helped with portions of this large project of entering about 40,000 items.) Over the years, Fran Finch has catalogued most of the books in the permanent collection, and she is currently leading a project that will incorporate the Organ Library's catalogue into that of Boston University, thus making it available throughout the world.

The Organ Library is not only a research library of organ music that serves clients on many continents, but it also serves a repository for the archives of many performers, to which has been most recently added the papers of M. Searle Wright. The large correspondence of Lillian Murtaugh and her successor Karen McFarlane also forms part of the Library's holdings. The Chapter is very fortunate in having the volunteer services of a professional archivist to catalogue these documents in a way that makes them accessible to researchers. A very large collection of sound recordings is also on deposit at the Organ Library. Peter McIntyre has been tireless in organizing this component of the Library's holdings—for various reasons, by no means the easiest task. Peter also undertakes many projects to ensure the smooth running of the Library that no one knows about until they have been completed.

The Organ Library could reach out to many more interesting projects, were the services of additional volunteers available. Inquiries about potential opportunities to serve are always welcome. Summer is a wonderful time to begin! As usual, donations from Chapter members of organ music, recordings, and books relevant to the objectives of the Library are always encouraged.
