


day before the AGO National Convention in Boston. The public is invited to sing in the congregation; finalists will play the 2006 III/43 Schoenstein organ.

Organists born on or after March 20, 1981, may apply. The application should include live recordings of the applicant playing hymns with a congregation singing, and must be received by March 20, 2014.

The competition complements the release of Stuart Forster's book <u>Hymn Playing: A Modern Colloquium</u>, MorningStar Music Publishers.
