The program was inspired by and featured much music from George Faxon's retirement recital given at Trinity Church in the 1980's and included organ repertory and arrangements of Faxon's as well as compositions by his wife, Nancy Plummer Faxon. The Master of Ceremonies, Jonathan Ambrosino, skillfully introduced many aspects of Faxon's personality, pedagogy and musicianship to the audience. The performers demonstrated the musical influences of their colleague with skill and superb interpretations on the Skinner at Old South Church. Mr. Faxon's violinist daughter, Emily, played as well on the program. Organist honored to perform were Leo Abbott, Richard Grant, Thomas Murray, Fred MacArthur and Rodger Vine.
