A Message from the Dean

Greetings!

I am very pleased to share with you that on January 1, 2022 the Rev. Brett Johnson accepted the appointment of Chaplain for the Boston AGO Chapter. This is a voluntary, non-elected post for a two-year term. Though having a Chaplain isn't required, many of us have certainly felt the absence of one during these unique and trying times. Rev. Johnson's background is quite extraordinary, and he will

no doubt share bits and pieces of that with us in his writings and in-person interactions over the coming years. He is also an accomplished musician— our members interested in having more clergy/musician related discussions and events will no doubt welcome his addition to our group! You will likely hear from him next month in Pipings; until then, let me simply share with you a bit of his biography.

Baritone Brett Johnson has been firmly established in the musical world of Boston for over thirty years. He has appeared regularly with the premier ensembles of the city, including Boston Baroque, Emmanuel Music and the Handel & Haydn Society. Comfortable in the rich Early Music world of the city, he has also done extensive solo work in oratorio and recital. His warm baritone, interpretive maturity and keen intellect have been appreciated throughout his performing career. Solo engagements have included Bach's St. Matthew Passion, Brahms's Requiem, Mozart's Requiem, Orff's Carmina Burana, and Monteverdi's Orfeo to name a few. Mr. Johnson has recorded with several chamber ensembles on Telarc International, Harmonia Mundi, and Koch International. He is a respected teacher of voice and a composer of a cappella works for chorus. His compositions have been performed by Emmanuel Music and The Orpheus Singers.

In the last several years, Brett has answered a calling to serve God in the world and in the church. He did four units of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) and served as an Oncology Chaplain. He left the hospital and closed his thriving voice studio in May 2018 to complete his seminary training. He has an MDiv from the Church Divinity School of the Pacific (CDSP) and is ordained in The Episcopal Church. He was very recently ordained after serving as a Transitional Deacon at All Saints Episcopal Church in Danvers, and will soon begin a new appointment in Beverly MA.

Pipes and Pops Concert Recording Now Available



Chapter Instrument Feature: Schloming Residence

Flentrop Orgelbouw (1978) - Originally built for Jacques van Oortmerssen


Other than the famous instrument in Adolphus Busch Hall (Harvard), there are not many instruments built by Flentrop in the New England area. The organ in the Schloming residence was built in 1975 for the Dutch organist Jacques van Oortmerssen. It was shipped to Cambridge MA in December 2021 adding to the number of that builder's instruments in the area. It features 6 ranks and 324 pipes with tracker action throughout. The 27-note pedal is permanently coupled to Manual 1, and Manual 1 can be coupled to Manual 2 by pulling Manual 1 toward the player.
