Dean's Message

Happy New Year!

The chapter's centenary year has finally arrived, and during this time I think it's good to pause and consider what we are celebrating. The Guild's founding charter states that we are an educational organization, and there are many ways that education plays a role in the activities of our chapter. The most obvious one is that of introducing young people to the organ and teaching them to play.

When I looked through my datebook recently, it finally sank in that I spend more time teaching than doing just about anything else. With so many private students in piano, carillon, and – yes! – organ, I am obviously a teacher, and it is a profession that I am happy I stumbled into. I receive a profound joy whenever a young person sits at an organ console for the first time and her whole face lights up, or when a student plays his first pedal piece for a service. Thanks to the dedication of several hardworking members of the Boston Chapter, it is possible to see this magical encounter happen every year. The Young Organists' Initiative, chaired by Mary Sue Willie and Stuart Forster, led an organ crawl for several young people and their parents in October, and this month the committee is hosting the Scholarship Audition on Saturday, January 22 at 1pm at Christ Church, Cambridge. This is now the eleventh year that we as a chapter have decided to support organ study for young people, and several of our current members are beneficiaries of this program. Do you have a student that might benefit from a scholarship? Invite them to audition! Contact Michael S. Murray for an application, and look for his contact information elsewhere in this newsletter.

For those young people who have already begun their studies, the Guild offers an opportunity to test their skills and compete with other young players. The Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists will happen here in Boston on Saturday, February 19, and the deadline for competitors to register is January 15. Rebuttal Rebuttal

In response to Leonardo Ciampa's rebuttal to an editorial concerning inclusiveness for organists who play electronic instruments, it seems to me that Mr. Ciampa mistakes the organist for the instrument. As I understand it, the Guild has decided to make an outreach to those organists who play electronic instruments. That is an entirely laudable endeavor, in my opinion. While I agree that the Guild should encourage its members to encourage their employers to purchase and maintain PIPE organs, I do not think we should marginalize or exclude individuals who play non-pipe alternatives, even if those individuals like the instruments they are playing. *De gustibus non disputandum*. While Mr. Ciampa is free to establish an alternative organization which excludes people who play and/or like non-pipe alternatives, I think that the Guild should be encouraged to find new ways to spread its message to non-members, and this outreach seems to me an appropriate way to do so.
