Young Organist Initiative News




Have you heard that we have three wonderful students participating in the Young Organist Initiative scholarship program this year? Ilario Faienza (grade 6), Liam Cumming (grade 8), and Ravi Burtner (grade 10) have been studying with YOI teachers Jeremy Bruns and Cathy Meyer and are preparing for a noontime recital at King's Chapel on June 25th. On Saturday, January 27, Ilario and Ravi, along with '22-23 YOI student Matthew McDonough (grade 12), performed works by Boellman, Zipoli, Schack, and Franck at Harvard Memorial Church in a masterclass with Dr. David von Behren. They first played their pieces on the Skinner organ, but were also given the opportunity to try the Fisk organ while others toured inside. YOI alumna Savannah Curro also gave a talk about how the YOI program gave her the foundation in organ that she needed to pursue a career in sacred music, from studying in high school, to graduating with a Bachelor's in Organ Performance from Mercer University, to now working on a Master's degree at Yale University. Applications are open for the five levels of professional certification exams administered through the AGO. Please **click here** and find your exam of interest; click on the exam name where you will find the "Apply" button, as well as all the pertinent information on fees, grading, musical choices, etc. Copies of past exams are also available for free on the relative exam page. You do not have to be a member of the Guild to take the exams, though member fees are lower.

For those preparing for the Service Playing Exam, you may be interested in a brand **new online study group**! The path to AGO certification need not be a lonely one! Join the new online community of organists who are preparing to take the Service Playing Certificate (SPC) exam. This will be a supportive forum to learn together and ask questions, guided by the leadership of the AGO Committee on Professional Certification. There are two upcoming sessions: February 8 and March 4, Anyone who registers for the SPC exam will receive info on how to participate.

DEADLINES: if you wish to take an exam before the spring, note these deadlines:
SPC: Feb 1 (sometimes there is a little flexibility on this -- write to me for details if you really want to try this year!)
CAGO: March 15
ChM, AAGO and FAGO: April 1



Pipings, Direct Emails, Privacy, and a New Policy: Benefits of Chapter Membership

New privacy considerations require that all persons who receive AGO publications must opt-in annually at membership renewal time, advising National and Chapters as to what personal data items may or may not be shared with the public. Since we have no means of enforcing this with non-members, we can no longer email *Pipings* as a courtesy for nonmembers who request it be sent to them. These privacy considerations also apply to the Chapter's substitute list. The Executive Committee has authorized an email that will be sent to non-members who have been receiving *Pipings* by monthly email. The substitute list will now be audited annually to make sure it remains as members-only.

The enforcement of these new privacy considerations gives me the opportunity to remind you of the many **benefits of AGO Chapter membership** :

- Pipings Chapter newsletter sent directly to you by email monthly
- Emails sent directly to you about Chapter events

- Become a member of the **Church Music Institute** with a discount of \$40 off the \$75 individual membership and receive individual membership and receive access to its online sacred music library with more than 18,000 choral selections and more than 13,000 organ composition titles. Login to ONCARD and click on Personal Information to access the code
- Receive a 5% discount on new contracts with **OneLicense**. Login to ONCARD and click on Personal Information to access the code.
- Become affiliate members of the Royal College of Organists for £25.00 and receive a

package of digital benefits including access to iRCO, the College's outstanding digital content hub that contains hundreds of videos, webinars, audio files, papers, articles and other educational material for the organist and choral director, as well as full access to online education and workshops. • Become eligible for discounted rates on a variety of coverages in the AGO Member Insurance Program through the Trust for Insuring Educators.

Fee increase for advertisments and Job Placements


